

Get Ready for WellSTAR!

Taking Stock of 2016's Wins

Back in September, I wrote "[what can we do in 90 days?](#)" to kick off the Analysis Phase. I am still amazed about the amount of work we performed. Distilling almost 1,500 requirements across 22 business capability categories took 11 days and 20 sessions, with 84 individual DOGGR, DOC, and Service Provider participants contributing their time and expertise. The result—a solid planning foundation for our project—is a prime example of a wise investment that will reap dividends in the months to come.

Phase 2 could be seen as the "main event": four releases to transform the Division into an agency equipped to meet current and future challenges. This is a large task as we begin involving the Operators in the next phase. Our communications, training strategy, testing, and continued development will better position us when the final bell goes off.

To be sure, we still have a lot of work ahead, and it won't be done all at once. The project is divided into **four releases that will take us through 2019.** While that sounds like a long time away, each release will bring **incremental functionality, in rolling six-month launches** (*more information is available in [page 3](#)*).

The collaboration seeds we have planted will continue to reap benefits, as our OCM, data cleansing, project management and software development teams work side by side to implement WellSTAR. Those four elements can only succeed with the quintessential one—the Division's expertise. Next month I will discuss the specific contributions we seek in 2017 from all of you to guide WellSTAR's success.

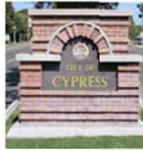
The get-togethers don't stop after the holidays—the OCM Team is coming to YOU!

RDBMS Fall Policy Meeting Recap

It wasn't quite Woodstock or Coachella, but over 70 representatives from 15 different states and one Canadian province gathered in Sacramento during the annual Fall Policy meeting. Hosted by the Ground Water Protection Council (GWPC), the event congregated Risk Based Decision Management System (RBDMS) users for a few days of collaborative discussion, project updates, and new initiative brainstorming.

WellSTAR took center stage as attendees sought insight into how California is implementing the next generation, **Web-enabled application**. From existing programs such as Underground Injection Control (UIC) and Geographic Information System (GIS) to ways to tackle our next challenges, participants came out with a deeper understanding of how inter-state workshops can yield solutions for the oil and gas industry. The conversation will continue April 2nd-6th, 2017 during the Spring Training meeting in Sarasota, FL.

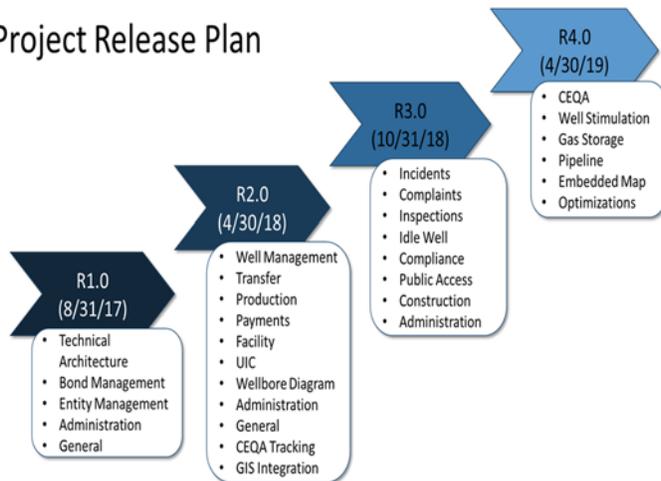


WellSTAR Scope and Releases 1-4

Project Release Plan



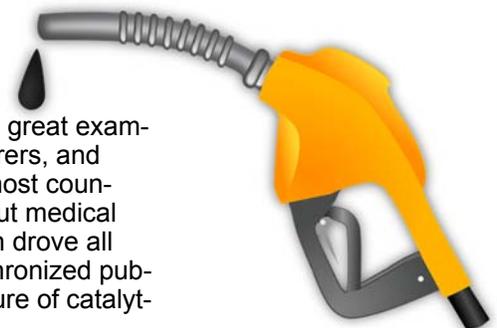
Last month's [newsletter](#) covered the timelines for releases 1-4. As we determine the contents of each release, we have received some questions of what programs will be part of WellSTAR. Our focus remains bringing the RDBMS product and functionality to California, converting WellSTAR and CalWIMS data and their corresponding processes, analyzing data from the Project-by-Project (PxP) reviews and addressing the reporting needs from SB-4 and SB-1281.

Change requests can be submitted via the [Change Control Board \(CCB\)](#), which will evaluate proposals based on business need and impact to the project's budget and schedule. Anyone can submit a [change request](#)—everyone has a voice!

Other elements are still essential to the success of the Division; being outside of the project doesn't mean something is unimportant or no longer needed. As we acknowledge the integral relationship between WellSTAR and DOGGR for 2017 and beyond, let's remember the project is not the *only* priority for the Division, and that other important programs will continue in parallel.

Good (and Bad) Moments in Change Management History

Do you remember a choice between unleaded and leaded gas? In a great example of collaboration between the oil and gas industry, car manufacturers, and governments, lead additive usage in gasoline has been banned in most countries. For decades lead had been used to increase octane ratings, but medical findings on the metal's impact on the environment and human health drove all the partners to mandate its reduction and eventual removal. A synchronized public relations campaign, with a focus on education, and the manufacture of catalytic converters directly into cars, produced a very successful change.

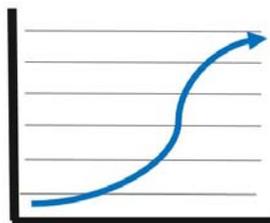
