Dear Resident,

You are receiving this mailer because the California State Department of Conservation (CalGEM) is working to permanently plug and seal an oil well in your area. In early December 2025, work to permanently plug a well at 314 Firmin Street, Los Angeles, CA 90026 will begin. CalGEM is a State of California regulatory agency that oversees oil wells to ensure public health and safety. CalGEM is coordinating this effort with LA City Fire Department.

Maps of the site are seen on the backside of this notice. The well is in the backyard of two residences and is surrounded by residential homes with a single vacant lot to the immediate north and a double vacant lot to the east. The work is expected to take about two months. It is anticipated that activities will be performed five days a week, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.



A virtual public meeting will be held on Monday, December 1, 2025 from 6:00 to 7:00 pm. Please join us! The Zoom meeting will be led in Spanish with English interpretation. This session will provide an opportunity to learn more about the project and ask questions. Scan the QR code to the left to register and attend the virtual meeting.

After registering, you will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the meeting.

This effort is part of California's Project Plug, which addresses the environmental impacts of legacy wells and facilities in our communities across the state. A Community Health and Safety Notification Plan has also been developed to ensure everyone understands how the work will be conducted and how the community will be protected. After the

work is complete, the location is anticipated to be in a state that poses no threat to the public or the environment.
