 \succ L, G, X \rightarrow D: 3 changes. Approximately 40 acres of L designated land was converted to the Quail Valley golf course in the Grass Valley quad. Approximately 15 acres of X land was converted to housing in the Grass Valley quad. Approximately 10 acres of Western Gateway Regional Park (developed) was formed on G designated land in Penn Valley on the Rough & Ready quad.

 \triangleright P, S, U \rightarrow L, G: No changes.

 \triangleright P, S, U \rightarrow X: No changes.

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UNUSUAL: Category changes, complications with the Farmland of Local Importance definition, or any other special circumstances in 2000.

 $G \rightarrow X$: 1 change. Approximately 60 acres of Western Gateway Regional Park (native vegetation) was formed from G designated land in Penn Valley on the Rough & Ready quad.

G. $X \rightarrow L$: 17 changes.

The "L" designation for Nevada County includes any Williamson Act Land. The most significant number of changes and total area converted in this county falls into this category. With an updated digital overlay of the Williamson Lands, additions along with area and line changes have brought the L polygons up to date. The total addition of L designated land is approximately 310 acres, shifted primarily from grazing land.

 $L \rightarrow G$: 2 changes.

"L" grazing areas on soil not considered of Prime or Statewide importance.

PROBLEM AREAS: What locations and map categories need careful checking in 2002? Why? Check the Darkhorse Golf Club by the Lake of the Pines for golf course and housing development.

OUT OF DATE BASE MAPS: Please list any base maps used for update or publication of this county which are woefully out of date due to extensive new development, road construction, etc. There are quads for this county that need road development updates.
