## Irrigated Farmland to Urban Land

There were thirteen changes total in this category with the majority of change occurring near Yuba City. The largest change was for ~50 acres of new "Masura" homes also near Yuba City.

> Grazing or Other Land to Urban Land

Nine changes in this category with approximately half due to increased density of ranchette housing just southwest and northwest of Yuba City. The rest of the changes (~130 ac) were because of new housing in or near the city of Olivehurst including 53 ac of the "Almond Grove Estates".

#### Irrigated Farmland to Grazing Land

The changes in this category (16 total) were because of land going fallow for at least 6 years. The largest quantity in acreage seen with this change was in the Sutter Buttes area. This includes the largest change of ~320 acres to grazing.

#### Irrigated Farmland to Other Land

The largest amount of acreage change for the county was seen in this category. Sixty-four changes overall were determined. Wetlands expansion east of Pennington, at the "Grey Lodge Farms" facility, accounted for the single largest change of ~200 acres.

## > Grazing or Other Land to Irrigated Farmland

Only eight conversions to irrigated farmland occurred in this update. The largest conversion (~160 ac) was for addition of rice near Kirkville and the second was found out of Nicolaus (~120 ac).

In the southern portion of the county, there is a 10,500-acre parcel that has been earmarked to be developed in the future as the South Sutter County Industrial/Commercial Reserve. Watch for urban development in this area.
