Here is what happened last night for those who weren't here. We started the meeting and then as agencies began to speak, the meeting was disruptive and was pulled off track. We then decided -- partly tried to listen what was going on to skip the presentations because people were saying they wanted, they wanted their voices to be heard, so we went right to elected officials and community representatives and then we went right -- from there we went to public comment and public comment continued for a while until there was a point where it became clear that some were not going to be able to express their views and at that point we adjourned the meeting.

So this evening, here is the flow of the -- as you

might imagine, ever since last night I've gotten a great deal of feedback about what this meeting should be, what it should look like, suggestions that -- about how this could go. I've heard that people don't want to spend the time on presentations because that will cut into the ability for comment. I've heard others that said the opposite that they actually would like to hear the presentations. Please let me point out that on the Department -- the Division's website, the Department of Conservation's Website, is a recorded version of the presentation. If you're really interested in hearing it, let us know and we are prepared to do it, but I'm going to start the meeting with this agenda, which goes like this. I'm going to

Many people were very disappointed that they did not get a chance to speak last night, tell their story, and get an opportunity to be on record. One of the tenants of our current legislative platform is to support policies preserving the role of local government and energy solutions to protect [INAUDIBLE] against rate increases. Over the past year, our member cities have become increasingly concerned about the reliability and affordability -- of our energy services -as a result of Aliso Canyon gas leak. Up to 75 percent of electricity consumed in our region is generated from natural gas and several of our largest commercial and industrial businesses and infrastructure providers rely on natural gas for their core operations.
