

## **Environmentally Sensitive - Near Human Occupied Places**

1760 (f)(1): A production facility within 300 feet from any public recreational area, or a building intended for human occupancy that is not necessary to the operation of the pipeline, such as a residences, schools, hospitals, or businesses.



# **Environmentally Sensitive – Near Wildlife Preserve, Sensitive Habitat**

1760 (f)(2): A production facility within 200 feet from any officially recognized wildlife preserve or environmentally sensitive habitat that is designated on a United States Geological Survey topographic map, designated waterways<sup>\*</sup>, or other surface waters such as lakes, reservoirs, rivers, canals, creeks, or other bodies that contain water throughout the year.






# Environmentally Sensitive – Within Coastal Zone [1760 (f)(3)]


#### PRC 30103.

(a) "Coastal zone" means that land and water area of the State of California from the Oregon border to the border of the Republic of Mexico, specified on the maps identified and set forth in Section 17 of Chapter 1330 of the Statutes of 1976, extending seaward to the state's outer limit of jurisdiction, including all offshore islands, and extending inland generally 1,000 yards from the mean high tide line of the sea. In significant coastal estuarine, habitat, and recreational areas it extends inland to the first major ridgeline paralleling the sea or five miles from the mean high tide line of the sea, whichever is less, and in developed urban areas the zone generally extends inland less than 1,000 yards.



# What is a "Sensitive Area"?

New AB 1420 regulations define a "Sensitive area" to mean any of the following: (1) An area containing a building intended for human occupancy, such as a residence, school, hospital, or business that is located within 300 feet of an active gas pipeline and that is not necessary to -300 ft the operation of the pipeline. (2) An area determined by the Supervisor to present significant potential threat to life, health, property, or natural resources in the event of a leak 300 ft from an active gas pipeline. (3) An area determined by the Supervisor to have an active gas pipeline that has a history of chronic leaks.



### What is a "Urban Area"?

1760 (t) <u>"Urban area"</u> means: a cohesive area of at least twenty-five business establishments, residences, or combination thereof, the perimeter of which is 300 feet beyond the outer limits of the outermost structures.



1760 (u) <u>"Urban pipeline"</u> means: That portion of any pipeline within an urban area as defined in 1760 (t).
